INSTRUCTORS

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Health Science offers a basic health care curriculum for first-year students and a diversified curriculum during the senior year. Both tracks prepare students for careers in the medical field. Basics of CPR and First Aid, State Tested Nurse Aide (STNA) and Phlebotomy certifications give students the opportunity to explore a variety of health fields in preparation for post-secondary study or the workforce.

1-CORE

In Health Science 2–Diversified, you will learn advanced skills related to various health occupations. The Health Science 2–Diversified Curriculum includes:

- Anatomy and physiology
- Medical terminology (CTAG)
- Employability skills
- Medical office procedures
- Phlebotomy

UNIFORM DETAILS:
