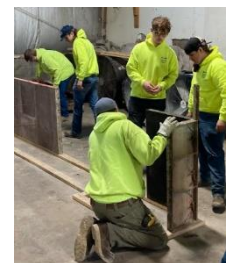
- Print & Graphics

- I interviewed several candidates and hired Michelle Weis as a full-time custodian. She started April 11. I think she will be a valuable asset to our team.
- I have been working on obtaining several quotes to have a better fuel management system installed here on campus. Our current fuel management process is very antiquated and not up to the state's auditing standards.
- We performed an inspection on all of our AED units with Nurse Diglia.
- We worked with Sidney Electric to replace four failed in-ground flag pole lights.
- Both heating elements were replaced in one of the Cres-Cor warming cabinets in the cafeteria.
- The new school cars have been outfitted with the proper safety items to be in compliance with Ohio pupil transportation code. Carpentry students built wood boxes to hold the items in the car trunks.
- We completed 27 preventative maintenance task and 55 maintenance requests in March.
