

Early Childhood Education provides a hands-on learning experience for those students interested in careers in education and childcare. Students gain experience while working in local daycare centers, preschools, kindergartens and special needs classrooms. They have the opportunity to earn certifications by the conclusion of the program that enables them to work in licensed childcare centers and to become licensed family care providers. Students will be prepared to earn a Child Development Associate credential, which would enhance employability in fields related to early childhood education and care.
