

Career Exploration is a sophomore program. It is designed to enable students to experience the Apollo programs while earning their credits to be accepted and enrolled into Apollo as a junior for a two-year program. Career Exploration students will rotate through eight or nine programs based on the results of their Career Scope interest inventory. In the final rotation, students may rotate through a new lab or can be invited back by an instructor to revisit a previous lab.

UNIFORM DETAILS:

Uniforms are ordered through the Apollo website. All students who were accepted prior to the first day of school are expected to be in uniform by September 16th. Students accepted within the first two weeks of school must be in uniform by October 1st. Students who are not in uniform by these deadlines may be sent home or have daily grade reductions for professionalism.

Purchased through online portal:

- Tshirt (long or short sleeved) or sweatshirt.
- *I recommend ordering enough to get you through one laundry cycle! Don't forget you will buy new uniforms next year for your 2-year program.*
- *It may be better to order four or five t-shirts and you can wear a solid long sleeve underneath. The t-shirts are required to be worn daily. You cannot wear anything but an Apollo sweatshirt over the t-shirt.*

Can be purchased anywhere:

- Solid colored tan khakis or blue or black jeans. No shorts. No holes or fraying in any of the pants.
- Closed-toe shoes, No sandals, slippers, crocs or Hey Dudes. You may wear athletic shoes or boots.

Please note:

- No hats
- No sweatpants
- No leggings

All first year students will receive one short-sleeve spirit wear shirt and one long-sleeve program shirt the first day of school.

Not needed. Career Exploration supplies PPE and tools for each rotation.
